Schenectady - Leonard O. Gilbert, 72, of Schenectady, passed away unexpectedly on Sunday, July 18, 2021.

Born in Schenectady on February 25, 1949, he was a son of the late Robert E. Sr. and Gertrude Aggen Gilbert. As a child, Leonard moved with his family to Fairfield, NY where they lived until moving back to Schenectady in 1968. He was a graduate of the West Canada Valley Central School District in Newport, NY and went on to attend Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy.

Leonard was employed as a machinist by General Electric Co. in Schenectady for several years.

He was a former member of Schenectady Chess Club and attended the Salvation Army in Schenectady. He had a very devout Christian faith.

In addition to his parents, he was also predeceased by an infant brother, Daniel Gilbert; and his identical twin brother and best friend, Leo A. Gilbert in 1969.

Survivors include his brothers, Robert Gilbert of Mariaville, Gary A. (Betty) Gilbert of Mariaville, Gordon L. (Kim) Gilbert of Mt. Juliet, TN, and Michael G.
